Now that all A-levels have changed to become linear courses we have decided not to enter students for AS-Level exams at the end of Year 12.

A large majority of students study three A-levels (or Pre-U in case of Chinese). Some students do four A-levels, a large majority of these students will study Mathematics, Further Mathematics and two other subjects. A handful of students (fewer than five) will do four A-levels without the inclusion of Further Mathematics. The only AS qualification we offer is AS Further Mathematics in Year 13.

To help students pick the three A-levels that are right for them, we ask students to start four subjects at the start of Year 12. Students are allowed to drop a subject from half way through Year 12. Most carry on with four until the end of Year 12 when they are assessed in internal school exams.

The qualifications offered in the Sixth Form in addition to A-levels and Pre-U are the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and Italian GCSE.
